## RULES OF THE HUNT:

- The Hunt will commence on Tuesday, August 1, 2023. All completed entries should be turned into the Waterville Valley Recreation Department by Thursday, August 31, 2023.
- Hunt packets will be available at the Waterville Valley Recreation Department and at various locations throughout the Valley. Packets can also be downloaded from [visitwatervillevalley.com](http://visitwatervillevalley.com)
- All participants will receive an entry packet with the list of the 25 sites to be found. A family, group or individual, can work together to finish the hunt, but only one entry and prize per group. The Hunt can be completed in as little as a weekend, or as a month-long quest.
- Participants will endeavor to find the 25 sites on the list. Hint: The Waterville Valley Historical Society's Sunday Trolley Tours are an excellent source of information, as is the Waterville Valley Guidebook. Locals may also prove to be very helpful.
- Plan your hunt carefully. Some sites listed may be a "two for" (meaning two or more sites on the list at one location)... So look around and be vigilant!
- Once the site has been found, take a photo on your phone (preferably with you in it). This will serve as proof of your find.
- When you have found all 25 sites, bring your entry form and phone into the Recreation Department for verification, and to claim your prize.

## Prizes:

- Our Grand Prizes have been provided through the generosity of our local merchants and “friends of the Society”. Grand Prizes will be awarded on a first come, first serve basis. Remember, one prize per entry. Successful participants will be given the opportunity to choose their prize. The earlier you finish the more choices you will have.

12. Sign for Specialist Marc P. Decoteau Memorial Highway
13. Giant “Welcome To Waterville Valley” sign
14. Motor Boat on a small pond
15. Waterville Valley Croquet Court
16. The “Little Museum at the End of the Road”
17. Trailhead sign for an “Angry” River Trail
18. Curious George Cottage
19. Old Water Barrel welcoming thirsty visitors into the Valley
20. Any tree with a weird root system
21. Lowest of the Cascade Falls, or a bag of trash collected while on the Quest
